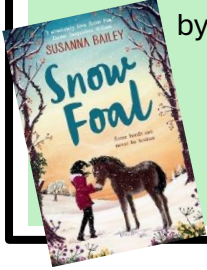


Read...

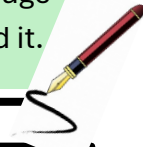
Read...

Moon Dog

Write...

a short story featuring an animal as the main character. Use stories that you have read as inspiration and include an exciting front cover and blurb that will encourage people to pick up your book and read it.



Create...

a new type of animal that can live underwater **and** on land. You can present this however you choose – a 3D model or a drawing are just two simple ideas.



Spend some time...

in your garden or in a park, listening to the sounds of the different animals around. You might like to do this more than once as the animals you hear will change over the course of the term.



Calculate...

the total distance and time it would take to travel between these British zoos. What is the shortest and longest distance and time? Cotswold Wildlife Park, London Zoo, West Midlands Safari Park and Longleat.

Research...

an animal that is close to extinction and present your facts and new knowledge about it. For example, you could use PowerPoint or make a poster.



Investigate...

the teeth of different animals. Can you find any that are unique or particularly interesting? Create a fact file or poster about these.



Visit...

a local area where you might find a variety of wildlife. Consider why it is a suitable habitat for the animals you see whilst there.

Visit...

Cotswold Wildlife Park – can you spot the animals that our school Green Team adopted?
